# **NEXT SUNDAY'S READINGS**

### **Thirty-second Sunday**

Wisdom 6:12-16 The book of Wisdom was written by a teacher who lived in Alexandria, Egypt, a center for Greek philosophy in the ancient world. Fearful that the Jewish people might be captivated by this secular thought, the author contrasts it with the true wisdom of God. In today's passage, wisdom is personified as a woman.

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians contains the earliest written reference we have to Jesus' death and resurrection. Paul and the early Christians expected Jesus to return in glory immediately. Some Thessalonians felt sad because members of their community had died, and they wondered how the dead would participate in the Second Coming. Paul addressed this issue in today's passage. (The description of Jesus' Second Coming is clearly symbolic and is not to be taken literally.)

Matthew 25:1-13 This gospel is the parable of the wise and foolish bridesmaids. Theologically, the story of the foolish and wise women is appropriate for, as we near the end of the liturgical year, the readings look forward to the end of the world. This reading focuses on our preparedness for the end.

**Reflect**: How do you keep yourself ready for the coming of God into your life?

# REOPENING GUIDE

Our parish reopening guide is a map – not an exact science or a rigid plan – to lead us toward gradually reopening at a pace following our State's Safe Start plan, and takes into account the mood of our community.

The purpose of this guide is to help us decide how and when to move forward, or (if necessary) how to move backward. No dates are assigned to movement between the guide steps. Currently we are in step three. Highlights of our current reopening practices include:

# Reopening Guide

This is meant to be a conceptual guide. It is not an exact plan for our reopening. It is based on CDC/State Health Department recommendations. We are in step three which now includes indoor Sunday Liturgies, LiveStreamed Liturgy, the option to receive Communion outside of weekend Mass, and smaller meetings/gatherings ≤10 people in larger meeting spaces. ≥10 & no more than 50 people: Outdoor meetings or on an online platform (e.g., Zoom).

\*Vulnerable Populations: Any age with pre-existing health conditions, compromised immunity, and care-takers of previously mentioned populations.

No dates are assigned to movement between steps. CDC/State Health Department guidelines will guide decisions.

Steps can move backward if necessitated by future outbreaks.

Preschool/Religious Formation/Youth related activities depend upon opening and practices of Brighton schools.

- ♦ Indoor weekend Liturgy celebrated in the main worship space. Masks must be worn. No assisting liturgical ministers, socially distant seating, socially distant reception of Holy Communion.
- ♦ Indoor weekday Liturgy in the main worship space celebrated minimally (i.e., no singing, no assisting liturgical ministers, socially distant seating, socially distant reception of Holy Communion). Masks must be worn.
- ♦ Drive up reception of Holy Communion, at the main entrance under the portico, will be available Saturdays 5:45—6:15 pm and Sundays 12:15—12:45 pm.
- ♦ The parish staff has normal work schedules. The parish office remains closed to visitors.
- ◆ Gatherings/meetings held online, or no more than 10 people in larger meeting spaces.
- ♦ Outdoor gatherings of 10 and no more than 50 people permitted with strict social distancing.

If you have any condition that will compromise your immune system (or if you care for someone with such a condition) PLEASE STAY HOME! There is no obligation to attend Mass and there is no obligation to receive Holy Communion through November 28.

"My children want to know why we have to go to Mass? What should I tell them?"

Children questioning why they have to follow x, y, or z religious rule is such an old phenomenon, the Bible even provides an answer! In the book of Deuteronomy, Moses gives instructions for when children start questioning God's rules (Dt.6:20-25.) His advice was to remind them we follow God's commandments out of gratitude for all the things He has done for us. We do what is right and just out of love for God

In Moses' day, they were thankful to God for freeing them from slavery in Egypt. They followed a strict code of laws that marked them as a people saved by God. In our own day, we celebrate Jesus freeing us from slavery to sin. We gather every Sunday to share in the Eucharist, to give thanks for the victory Christ won for us, and to celebrate the new life He offers us!

Will your children accept this answer? Probably not, but sometimes all we can do is plant the seeds of faith. We trust that someday, they will better understand why we make time to give thanks to God for all He has done.
