

NEXT SUNDAY'S READINGS

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

Exodus 24:3-8 Today's passage from the book of Exodus describes the covenant between God and the Israelite people. A covenant is a solemn agreement made between two parties and was usually sealed in blood. In ancient times, blood was considered the source of life. To sprinkle two people with the same blood bonded them as closely as if they were blood relatives.

Hebrews 9:11-15 On Yom Kippur, the high priest sacrificed a goat on the altar in the temple. Then he took some of the blood into the holiest place in the temple sanctuary where only he was allowed to go. There, he sprinkled that blood as a renewal of the covenant made at Mount Sinai, and prayed that God would forgive the sins they had committed during the previous year. This ritual is the backdrop for today's reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

Mark 14:12-16, 22-26 Mark's description of the course of the meal provides us with a view of one of the earliest forms of the Eucharist – as it was celebrated at the time Mark wrote his gospel. It is different from the description offered by Paul in his letter to the Corinthians, and by John in his gospel. But the essentials are the same; the cup is the blood covenant of old, and in drinking the cup disciples (through all ages) share in the salvation history to the present.

Reflect: When you receive Holy Communion and hear the words, "Body of Christ...Blood of Christ," what are some of the thoughts and feelings that surface in you?

Candles



Early Registration Tuition Discount

The early registration period for the 2021-2022 Formation year is underway until June 30. Families who register and pay in full within one week, will receive an early registration discount of \$12 off the normal tuition rate. Please consider registering as soon as possible; it is tremendously helpful to us as we plan the upcoming year.

Tuition rates for the 2021-2022 Formation year will be as follows:

Families with 1 child: \$120

Families with 2 children: \$160

Families with 3+ children: \$200

AWAITING THE RESURRECTION

St. Mary Magdalen has two places for the interment of cremains: the Resurrection Tower (Columbarium) and the Shrine of the Cross. The policies governing the Resurrection Tower and the Shrine of the Cross can be viewed on our parish website under Sacraments.



The interior of the Tower has 1,500 niches; each holds one or two special urns. The names of each person interred there will be engraved on their urn and niche. The parishioner fee for a space in the Tower is \$2,600. One of our parishioners donates the service of engraving the names on the urns and the niche.

The names of one or two people whose ashes are buried at a space at the Shrine of the Cross will be engraved on the stone marking their resting place. The parishioner cost for a space at the Shrine of the Cross is \$500, plus the added cost of engraving the stone and opening and closing the grave.
