NEXT SUNDAY'S READINGS

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19–23: The second book of Chronicles is part of a series which traces Jewish history from its beginning down to the end of the exile. Today's reading is the conclusion of the book. It summarizes the reasons for the Babylonian exile and tells how the exile ended after 70 years. Second Chronicles was placed last in the Jewish Bible. When we hear the final words of this reading, we will hear how the Jewish Scriptures conclude on a positive note.

Ephesians 2:4–10: Ephesus is located on the western coast of what is today Turkey. The author of this letter to the Christians in Ephesus writes about the saving power of God that is available to both Jews and non-Jews. Today's passage reminds us that salvation is God's gift alone. "Gift" is the root meaning of the word "grace."

John 3:14–21: Nicodemus is a Pharisee and a leader in the Jewish community. He comes to Jesus at night, probably because he does not yet belong to the light. He addresses Jesus as "Rabbi" or "Teacher" who has come from God. Jesus responds by noting the necessity of being "born from above" if one is to see the Kingdom of God.

Reflect: When is it difficult for you to believe?

Lent Week 3

During the season of Lent I am going to attempt to preach a "series" of homilies, but if you do miss one of the series, you will not be left behind. I hope that together we can walk through each Sunday of Lent keeping in mind an old idea about which Blaise Pascal wrote. He wrote about how each of us has a God-shaped hole in each of our hearts.

This weekend I'll be focusing on the gift of obedience that God offers us to fill our God-shaped hole. Obedience, though, is not blindly following commands. The word obey means "to listen," but is deeper than lips speaking to ears. The gift of obedience that God offers us is one in which heart speaks to heart.

I will be available for the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation all day on Monday, March 22. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed in the worship space all day during this time as well. *Just like during Advent, you will need to sign-up for a time slot.* Sign-ups will begin next week and be available in the gathering space, online, and by calling the parish office. If you cannot come on Monday, March 22, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is available every Saturday from 3-4:00 p.m., and by appointment.

The Pastoral Council will be working to put together reopening events to help all of us reconnect as a community safely as we move into the Easter season and into what hopefully will be much better weather.

CURRENT PARISH GUIDELINES

- ♦ Indoor weekend Liturgy celebrated in the main worship space. Masks must be worn. No assisting liturgical ministers, socially distant seating, socially distant reception of Holy Communion.
- ♦ Indoor weekday Liturgy in the main worship space celebrated minimally (i.e., no singing, no assisting liturgical ministers, socially distant seating, socially distant reception of Holy Communion). Masks must be worn.
- ♦Drive up reception of Holy Communion, at the main entrance under the portico, will be available Saturdays 5:45—6:15 pm and Sundays 12:15—12:45 pm.
- ◆The parish staff has normal work schedules. The parish office remains closed to visitors.
- ♦ Gatherings and meetings are held online.
- Outdoor gatherings of 10 and no more than 50 people permitted with strict social distancing.

If you have any condition that will compromise your immune system (or if you care for someone with such a condition) PLEASE STAY HOME! There is no obligation to attend Mass and there is no obligation to receive Holy Communion through May 16, 2021.

GETTING THE VACCINE

Some people have expressed moral concerns about getting the COVID-19 vaccine. Much of this is based on misinformation and lack of understanding of Catholic moral principles.

Bishops throughout the world, and the Vatican, have issued statements indicating there is nothing immoral about receiving this vaccine. Those who worry about the way this vaccine and other vaccines were developed do not understand that receiving the vaccine does NOT mean participating in anything immoral. In fact, it may be immoral (that is to say, not supporting the Common Good) to forego receiving the vaccine unless you have a legitimate medical reason not to receive it.
