

ALL THINGS CONSIDERED

MEMORIAL DAY began after the Civil War to honor those who died in the battle to preserve the Union and to free the enslaved. Michigan was the first state to make Decoration, or Memorial Day, a legal holiday (1871). For almost 150 years, the purpose of the day has been expanded. It began as a day to remember and honor all those who died in our nation's wars; and has grown to include remembering and honoring all our deceased friends and family as well.

MEMORIAL DAY LITURGY I hope you will join me on Monday morning for the **9 am Liturgy**. We will pray for all those who have gone before us in faith, especially those whose cremains rest here. Weather permitting, the Liturgy will be on the plaza, near the tower and looking toward the shrine.

SISTER JOYCE is a Franciscan Sister from Tiffin, Ohio, and she joined our staff in 2001. She has had many responsibilities, but she usually prefers to stay out of the spotlight.

She is a humble, hard-working and faithful pastoral minister who has added a great deal to our parish community. In her quiet, gentle and, often humorous way, Sr. Joyce has made a difference in the lives of many and has been a real inspiration to all who know her.

As many of you know, Sr. Joyce was in a bad car accident on January 6. She sustained several injuries, but the worst were to her right foot and ankle. Several bones were broken, and it has been a long recovery. She has made good progress and returned to her duplex on Thursday.

Given all that has happened and what still lies ahead, Sr. Joyce has decided to retire. But before she does, we would like to have a parish celebration to thank her for her service and to cheer her on as she moves to the next phase of her life

On **Saturday, June 1**, at the **4:30 Liturgy**, we want to honor Sr. Joyce. We will give her our community's blessing and have a reception for her in the Community Room. If you are unable to be there, I would hope that you send her a card and wish her well.

THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

Acts 1:1-11 Today's passage takes us back to the beginning verses of the Acts of the Apostles and sets forth the themes that Luke is going to develop throughout this, the longest book of the New Testament. His major theme is the role of the Holy Spirit, who enables the Apostles to be effective witnesses to Jesus. The Holy Spirit is mentioned 57 times in the Acts of the Apostles.


Hebrews 9:24-28, 10:19-23 On Yom Kippur, the high priest sacrificed a goat on the altar in the temple. Then he took some of the blood into the holiest place in the temple sanctuary where only he was allowed to go. He sprinkled the blood there as a renewal of the covenant made at Mt. Sinai, and prayed that God would forgive all their sins committed during the previous year. This ritual is the backdrop for today's readings from the letter to the Hebrews.

Luke 24:46-53 The Ascension means that Christians have always believed that Jesus, having completed his earthly mission, returned to God from whom He was sent, and now takes up his continuing role as priest, prophet, and king. Christ has taken on the role of intermediary in a new and entirely spiritual way. The mission of the eleven further demonstrates the continuing action of the risen Christ.
