Happy Feast Day! It's great to be able to celebrate our patron saint together this weekend in the Liturgy. Saint Mary Magdalen is a living reminder of the impact a relationship with Christ can have on someone. Scripture says that Jesus helped heal many hurts in Mary Magdalen's life. He embraced her as someone of worth even though she had so much brokenness in her life. Through Mary Magdalen Jesus shows us that each of us is of great worth in God's eyes. Each of us has the potential to be bold witnesses to the Resurrection. In a special way this weekend, let us ask Saint Mary Magdalen for her prayers and friendship as we continue to strive to imitate her in witnessing to the Good News of Jesus' resurrection.

I am continuing to meet with members of the parish staff and parishioners. I want to again invite you to take an opportunity to come and meet with me so I can learn more about our parish and meet you. I welcome all individuals and/or couples who would like to schedule some time with me to do so. Please keep in mind and heart these questions to guide our time together:

I do personally schedule my appointments, so please call the office or E-mail me at pastor@saintmarymagdalen.org. Many folks have asked if I would be able to come to dinner in their homes to meet. I am very grateful for the invitations! Meeting together at the parish office enables me to give more people more opportunities to sit down and chat with me. So, while I am grateful for the invitations to dinner, I will initially decline so I can be as available as possible during my first weeks and months here at the parish.

I did make a recent change that directly affects me, and how you can reach me. If you do call the parish in a critical situation or emergency when the office is closed, you can reach me easily by dialing an office extension listed on our voicemail message. I cannot always be available, but I hope this simplifies how to reach me if anyone finds themselves in a difficult and timely situation. I asked to have the phone set up this way so we could disconnect the land line at the rectory. Now, if an emergency call comes in after-hours, I will receive it directly on my cell phone. This is particularly for the purpose of reaching me to report a funeral, or to request an urgent hospital or hospice patient visit. For any visits to the sick that are not emergencies, please contact me at the parish office during regular hours or speak to me after Mass. I'm glad to visit the sick both in their homes and at the hospital.

SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY

Genesis 18:20-32 Today's passage from Genesis is another episode from the life of Abraham, our father in faith. He lived near Sodom, a city notorious for its wickedness. In this passage, Abraham employs the Middle-Eastern technique of bartering to negotiate with God over the future of that city.

Colossians 2:12-14 This week we continue our series of readings from the letter to the Colossians. We have seen how this letter emphasizes Christ as the sole mediator between God and all creation. Today's passage speaks of how we become one in Christ.

Luke 11:1-13 Jesus has been sent in order to proclaim the Kingdom of God. To petition God for the kingdom is one of the things Jesus teaches his disciples in today's gospel selection. Petition is centered on the desire and search for the kingdom to come, in keeping with the teaching of Christ.

Reflect: What good gift do you want to ask God for and for whom?
