NEXT SUNDAY'S READINGS

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

Wisdom 1:13-15, 2:23-24 The book of Wisdom was addressed to a group of Jews living in pagan territories. It begins with a sharp contrast between good and evil. In the pagan world of that time, most people believed that there were good gods and bad gods. The author emphasizes the Jewish belief that that there is just one God who is the source only of goodness and life.

2 Corinthians 8: 7, 9, 13-15 Today's excerpt from Second Corinthians paints a picture of Paul the pastor at work. The Jewish people in Jerusalem who had become Christian were a small minority and were being persecuted. This brought on financial hardships. Paul wants his Gentile converts in Greece to help them out and show that the bonds of Christianity cut across ethnic lined.

Mark 5:21-43 Note that in this Gospel, both females are associated with the number 12. This presents each one as an image of the Church: the people of Israel in the Old Testament, who in one sense are at the point of death and in another suffer from chronic impurity. Giving the girl something to eat anticipates the Eucharist and prefigures what will happen in the feedings of the crowds.

Reflect: In faith, do you ever expect miracles? Why or why not?

Catholic Social Teachings

The Common Good - What the Church Teaches

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed..." (Luke 4: 18-19)

The second pillar of Catholic social teachings is that of the Common Good. Catholic Tradition has long bound up the corporal or bodily works of mercy with the spiritual works of mercy and insists that care for the human person means care for the Common Good of all.

Pope Paul VI reminds us: "The right to private property is not absolute and unconditional. No one may appropriate surplus goods solely for his own private use when others lack the bare necessities of life. In short, 'as the Fathers of the Church and other eminent theologians tell us, the right of private property may never be exercised to the detriment of the common good."

Those to whom much is given, much will be required. (Luke 12:48) What gifts has God given you and how do you give them away to others in need?

Over the next few weeks, we will summarize each of the four pillars in this column. As Catholics, we must reflect on how these teachings might change our parish, and each of us.

JUNE IS ALZHEIMER'S AND BRAIN AWARENESS MONTH

Alzheimer's disease and other
dementias are a major public health
issue. Alzheimer's is a type of dementia
that affects memory, thinking and
behavior. Symptoms eventually grow severe enough to
interfere with daily tasks. If you or someone you care for is
having memory problems, please see your doctor.¹

Did you know?

Worldwide, 50 million people are living with dementia. 1 in 3 seniors dies from Alzheimer's or another dementia. 1

Studies show that patients with Alzheimer's increased their food intake when using dinnerware with vivid colors, such as red dishes.²

10 Early Signs and Symptoms of Alzheimer's¹

Encourage your loved one to seek care from their doctor if you notice these symptoms:

- 1. Memory loss that disrupts daily life
- 2. Challenges in planning or solving problems
- 3. Difficulty completing familiar tasks
- 4. Confusion with time or place
- 5. Trouble understanding visual images and spatial relationships
- 6. New problems with words in speaking or writing
- 7. Misplacing things and losing the ability to retrace steps
- 8. Decreased or poor judgment
- Withdrawal from work or social activities
- 10. Changes in mood and personality

How to help someone with dementia³:

Avoid overstimulation. Be reassuring. Don't argue or yell. Keep a daily routine. Seek support when needed
