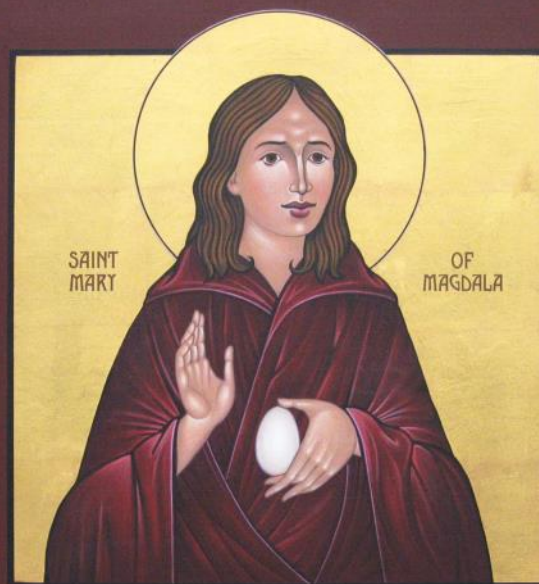

LOWERY'S LINES

All Weekend Liturgies Indoor Beginning this Weekend

The weekend after Labor Day weekend, September 12/13, we will begin celebrating the remaining two Liturgies – 9am and 11am - in our worship space. Since May 31 we began slowly reopening and reintroducing Liturgical celebrations both outside and inside. We have done a lot of difficult work as a community to come to the point where we are confident in celebrating the Liturgies along with so many other day-to-day activities in a safely distant, more limited, and healthy fashion. All of us has had to relearn how to be social, to stay connected, and to stay healthy.

Please remember to be vigilant about wearing a covering over both your nose and your mouth while you are inside any parish building. Disposable face coverings are available in the gathering space if you forget to wear one. While we are a worship space, we are also a work space, school/daycare space, and social venue. People are employed by the parish and people are volunteering their work out of service to each person who comes in our doors. They deserve to be able to come work or volunteer in an environment that reflects our love and appreciation for them, and our desire to keep them healthy so they may continue to serve us. I also personally ask you to help me stay physically healthy as I minister to you by covering both your nose and your mouth while inside our parish buildings.

Virtual Options for Mass Continue

Our Saturday 4:30pm Liturgy will continue to be available on LiveStream, and available for rebroadcast at approximately 6:30pm on Saturdays. People with any health complications, the elderly, and people who care for others in vulnerable populations should continue to avoid gatherings of people. The obligation to attend Sunday Liturgy continues to be lifted through at least November 28.

New Option to Receive Holy Communion Outside of Mass

People who do want to receive Communion over the weekend, but who do not feel comfortable being at indoor, sustained gatherings of people during Mass, may drive up to the main entrance under the portico on **Saturdays from 5:45-6:15pm or on Sundays from 12:15-12:45pm** and receive Holy Communion without leaving their vehicles. We encourage you to watch the Liturgy from home as part of your reception of Holy Communion outside of Mass. As your Pastor, I feel it is a just cause to offer this option during a global pandemic, and another way to keep people connected to Christ and our parish.

Through all of this, let us make it our goal to stay connected to Christ and safely to one another using all the means we have possible.

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Isaiah 55:6 – 9 The prophetic words in today's reading were spoken during the Israelites' exile in Babylon. Earlier, the prophet had proclaimed that God was looking mercifully upon them and would soon free them. In today's reading, the prophet points out that they now have a window of opportunity and should take advantage of God's willingness to forgive.

Philippians 1:20 – 24, 27 For four weeks our second reading will be taken from Paul's letter to the Philippians. When Paul wrote this letter, he was in prison for preaching the Gospel and he faced the possibility of execution. A person in those circumstances tends to think long thoughts about death, and death is what Paul is wrestling with in today's passage.

Matthew 20:1 - 16 The parable of the laborers in the vineyard is a parable of the kingdom of heaven, describing both the means of entry into the kingdom and the equality its inhabitants enjoy there. God calls us as coworkers to prepare the earth for the kingdom, which has yet to bud, bloom, and bear fruit. Heaven is wage enough for anyone, no matter how long one has labored with Christ.

Reflect: Put into words "God's Generosity".

REOPENING GUIDE

Our parish reopening guide is a map – not an exact science or a rigid plan – to lead us toward gradually reopening at a pace following our State’s Safe Start plan, and takes into account the mood of our community. The purpose of this guide is to help us decide how and when to move forward, or (if necessary) how to move backward. No dates are assigned to movement between the guide steps.

Currently we are in step three. Highlights of our current reopening practices include:

- ♦ Indoor weekend Liturgy celebrated in the main worship space. Masks must be worn. No assisting liturgical ministers, socially distant seating, socially distant reception of Holy Communion.
- ♦ Indoor weekday Liturgy in the main worship space celebrated minimally (i.e., no singing, no assisting liturgical ministers, socially distant seating, socially distant reception of Holy Communion). Masks must be worn.
- ♦ Drive up reception of Holy Communion, at the main entrance under the portico, will be available Saturdays 5:45—6:15 pm and Sundays 12:15—12:45 pm.
- ♦ The parish staff has normal work schedules. The parish office remains closed to visitors.
- ♦ Gatherings/meetings held online, or no more than 10 people in larger meeting spaces.
- ♦ Outdoor gatherings of 10 and no more than 50 people permitted with strict social distancing.

People in vulnerable populations should STAY HOME.

Reopening Guide

This is meant to be a conceptual guide. It is not an exact plan for our reopening. It is based on CDC/State Health Department recommendations.

We are in step three which now includes indoor Sunday Liturgies, LiveStreamed Liturgy, the option to receive Communion outside of weekend Mass, and smaller meetings/gatherings ≤10 people in larger meeting spaces. ≥10 & no more than 50 people: Outdoor meetings or on an online platform (e.g., Zoom).

Preschool/Religious Formation/Youth related activities depend upon opening and practices of Brighton schools.

If you are age 65 and older or if you have any condition that will compromise your immune system (or if you care for someone with such a condition) PLEASE STAY HOME!
There is no obligation to attend Mass and there is no obligation to receive Holy Communion through November 28.

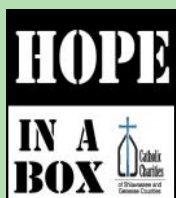

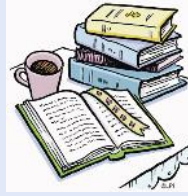
