LOWERY'S LINES

Epiphany Proclamation!

It is a tradition to announce the date of Easter on today's solemnity of the Epiphany. The proclamation of the date of Easter and the other moveable feasts on Epiphany dates from a time when calendars were not readily available. It was necessary to make known the date of Easter in advance, since many celebrations of the liturgical year depend on its date. The number of Sundays that follow Epiphany, the date of Ash Wednesday, and the number of Sundays that follow Pentecost are all computed in relation to Easter. Although calendars now give the date of Easter and the other feasts in the liturgical year for many years in advance, the Epiphany proclamation still has value. It is a reminder of the centrality of the resurrection of the Lord in the liturgical year and the importance of the great mysteries of faith which are celebrated each year.

Know, dear brothers and sisters, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior.

On the twenty-sixth day of February will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season.

On the twelfth day of April we will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the twenty-fourth day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the thirty-first day of May, the feast of Pentecost.

On the fourteenth day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the twenty-ninth day of November, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever.

Installation Mass Next Weekend at 11:00 a.m.

Bishop Boyea will be here next Sunday to celebrate the 11:00 a.m. Liturgy with us and to install me as your second Pastor. While I have officially been your pastor since June 26, I put off scheduling this brief rite so that you could get used to me being here. A few weeks ago at Confirmation, the Bishop asked why he had not yet come to install me. I did not have an answer; and so he set the date. Please know of my joy to be here as a member of our parish and to serve you as your pastor.


THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7 This section of the book of Isaiah contains the words of a prophet who spoke to God's people exiled in Babylon. Four different times, the prophet speaks about a mysterious servant who will one day deliver the Israelites and make them great again. Today we hear one of these messages.

Acts 10:34-38 The Apostle Peter was originally skeptical about preaching the Gospel to non-Jews. But one day, the Holy Spirit summoned him to preach to a Gentile---the pagan army officer Cornelius and his household. We will now hear Peter speak about the remarkable effect this had upon him.

Matthew 3:13-17 John asks Jesus why he seeks baptism. The Church Fathers responded that Jesus was baptized to sanctify the waters for the Church, so that all future Baptisms would be touched by the waters blessed by Jesus himself.

Reflect: Name one way that being a Baptized Christian changes your everyday life.

Today we celebrate the wonderful **Feast of the Epiphany.** Epiphany is a Feast Day within the Church's liturgical celebration of Christmas. In the Western tradition, we associate it with the "Visit of the Magi," or visitors from the East. Epiphany is traditionally celebrated the 12th day after Christmas, (Twelfth Night).

Epiphany takes its name from the Greek *epiphania*, a manifestation. Jesus, born quietly in Bethlehem's stable, is revealed, or made manifest, as the Son of God. In the recognition of Him by the Magi, the Christ, He is revealed to the "nations."

Here are five facts about the Feast of the Epiphany you may not know:

- ♦The three Kings represent Europe, Arabia and Africa.
- ♦ Hundreds of years ago, roast lamb was served at Epiphany to honor Christ and the Three Kings' visit.
- ♦ In some European countries, children leave their shoes out to be filled with gifts, while others leave straw for the three kings' horses.
- ♦ In Prague, a Three Kings swim commemorates Epiphany Day at the VItava River.
- In New York, El Museo del Barrio has celebrated and promoted Three Kings' Day annual parades for over thirty years.


