LOWERY'S LINES

"Not my area!" I lived in common with other seminarians during my time studying theology at the University of Saint Michael's College – Toronto. Since we lived together and were all in seminary studies, we also shared chores around the house and took turns cooking dinner during the week. One of the guys I lived with was pretty faithful to his task of a keeping our living room clean. But if he noticed a mess in another room, or if the garbage had to be taken out, or if the paper towel roll was empty, he would exclaim, "Not my area!" and walk away.

Sometimes in parish life – just as in family life, school communities, and work places – we can become overly protective or possessive of our "area:" a ministry we always do, a space we always park in, a chair we always sit in, or an activity we always participate in. In doing this we can sometimes neglect other areas or isolate our role from the roles and responsibilities of others. But no role, responsibility, or ministry can be effective on its own (1 Cor 12). We are all interconnected in Christ.

All of the opportunities for volunteering in our parish are equally important and essential to the viability and vibrancy of our parish. Thanks to everyone who has signed up for the various service ministries during the month of September. Beginning next weekend, please take advantage of the opportunity to sign up and serve as a liturgical minister. If you are new or newer to the parish, making a ministry commitment can be a great way to get to know other parishioners better.

Lines of Opportunity: Funeral Vigil Leaders

In addition to our deacons and me, I would like to expand the number of people we can call upon to minister to families when they have lost a loved one by leading the Vigil (wake) service the evening before a funeral takes place. This ministry requires that you be comfortable leading people in prayer, reading in front of others, empathy, and compassion. If you feel this might be something the Lord has gifted you for, please reach out to me. I will also put sign-up Peace, sheets out for this ministry. A training would take place prior to putting anyone into a regular rotation.

TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY

Habakkuk 1:2-3, 2: 2-4 The book of the prophet Habakkuk is one of the smaller books of the Bible. A contemporary of Jeremiah, he preached at a time when Babylon threatened to destroy Jerusalem. Today's passage is a dialogue between the prophet and the Lord.

2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14 Although the author attributes second Timothy to St. Paul, it was probably written by someone else as much as 30 years after Paul's death. This was an acceptable practice at the time. One important theme of this letter is the need to be faithful to the Gospel and not to be swayed by false teachings.

Luke 17:5-10 The disciples ask for an increase of faith and Jesus responds by saying, in effect, "Don't worry about how much faith you have. It is a powerful thing that even a tiny bit of it makes you miracle workers. You have faith, now nurture it and make it grow."

Reflect: How am I growing in my faith? How can I nurture it more?

Magdalen's Kitchen Sign-Up Calling ALL Dish Washers!!!

We recruit volunteers for Magdalen's Kitchen, the community meal we host here every Monday, about every six weeks. Dining room servers are typically the first group to be filled. The last group typically is the dish washers. So what do dish washers do? The process is simple with a commercial dishwasher. The used items are placed in a rack, rinsed, placed in the dishwasher, taken out, allowed to air dry, and finally put away. The dish washers are asked to come at 6 pm, eat dinner with the guests, then begin their task. The dishwashing process is typically done by 7:15. Are you up to the challenge? Sign-ups are at the Charity and Justice desk in the gathering space.
