SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Sirach 15:15-20

The book of Sirach was written by a wise teacher who lived 200 years before Christ. Sirach ran a school for young people in Jerusalem. In today's passage, he urges his students to make the right choices in life.

1Corinthians 2:6-10

Paul continues to address the Corinthian community who criticized him because, according to Greek standards, he lacked wisdom. To the Greeks wisdom meant a certain pattern of logical reasoning that followed fixed forms. We will hear Paul speak of a wisdom that is greater than this.

Matthew 5:17-37Jesus wants his followers to enter the kingdom, but he knows they won't unless they embrace his new, higher standard of morality. His teaching flows from his awareness of sin's consequences. Jesus is straightforward and emphasizes the truth.

Reflect: What piece of wisdom do I wish everyone knew?
