

NEXT SUNDAY'S READINGS

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

Isaiah 50:4-7 Chapters 40 – 55 of the Book of Isaiah contain the message of a prophet who spoke to God's people during their exile in Babylon. Several times the prophet speaks about a servant who will one day deliver God's people. Because the Servant is portrayed as suffering, Christians have identified Jesus with him.

Philippians 2:6-11 We have in this passage one of the most beautiful sections of Paul's letter to the Philippians. He wants the members of the community at Philippi to work harder at unity and humility, and to teach this he quotes an early Christian hymn about Jesus.

Mark 14:1 - 15:47 The evangelist Mark sees the Passion of Jesus as the highpoint of his ministry that began after his Baptism by John and the Spirit driving him out into the desert where he was tempted by Satan. Mark's account of Jesus' ministry is brief and to the point but uses 1/5 of the Gospel on the Passion. Mark's intention was to show that Jesus is the suffering servant who is the Son of God. Jesus finds his glory by following the will of God to the cross.

Reflect: What part of the Passion story most touches your life this year?

LOWERY'S LINES

Lent Week 5

During the season of Lent I am attempting to preach a "series" of homilies. I hope that together we can walk through each Sunday of Lent keeping in mind an old idea about which Blaise Pascal wrote. He wrote about how each of us has a God-shaped hole in each of our hearts.

This weekend I'll be focusing on the gift of faith that God offers us to fill our God-shaped hole. Faith has little to do with religious practice per se. Faith is the personal relationship we have with God. God always initiates this relationship and then invites us to respond. How we understand our experiences in light of faith is what we call theology. Our theological understandings lead us to develop doctrines and common religious practices.

CURRENT PARISH GUIDELINES

- ♦ Indoor weekend Liturgy celebrated in the main worship space. Masks must be worn. No assisting liturgical ministers, socially distant seating, socially distant reception of Holy Communion.
- ♦ Indoor weekday Liturgy in the main worship space celebrated minimally (i.e., no singing, no assisting liturgical ministers, socially distant seating, socially distant reception of Holy Communion). Masks must be worn.
- ♦Drive up reception of Holy Communion, at the main entrance under the portico, will be available Saturdays 5:45—6:15 pm and Sundays 12:15—12:45 pm.
- ullet The parish staff has normal work schedules. The parish office remains closed to visitors.
- ♦ Gatherings and meetings are held online.
- ◆Outdoor gatherings of 10 and no more than 50 people permitted with strict social distancing.

If you have any condition that will compromise your immune system (or if you care for someone with such a condition) PLEASE STAY HOME! There is no obligation to attend Mass and there is no obligation to receive Holy Communion through May 16, 2021.

GETTING THE VACCINE

Some people have expressed moral concerns about getting the COVID-19 vaccine. Much of this is based on misinformation and lack of understanding of Catholic moral principles.

Bishops throughout the world, and the Vatican, have issued statements indicating there is nothing immoral about receiving this vaccine. Those who worry about the way this vaccine and other vaccines were developed do not understand that receiving the vaccine does NOT mean participating in anything immoral. In fact, it may be immoral (that is to say, not supporting the Common Good) to forego receiving the vaccine unless you have a legitimate medical reason not to receive it.
