LOWERY'S LINES

Reopening Right Along

As I am writing this on Monday, I am looking forward to a Wednesday meeting planned with the Pastoral Council members who have been helping me with reopening strategies. I will also be seeking input from the parish health ministry team (comprised of parishioners who are health care professionals). I'm cautiously optimistic that we will be able to continue to move forward toward more "normal" practices in Liturgy and in our meetings.

For now I want to continue to encourage us to keep non-essential meetings, Liturgies, ceremonies, gatherings, etc., to a minimum, and whenever possible, to meet outside. We have beautiful grounds. We should take advantage of the warmer weather and our property if we are a small group and wish to meet. Groups that do not wish to meet outside should continue to utilize Zoom and other online platforms to connect. If these guidelines change, broaden, etc., after my Wednesday meeting mentioned above and after the publication of this week's bulletin, I will notify you through E-mail and the most updated information will also be posted to our parish website.

As I have said before, I encourage you not to be in larger gatherings if you are in a vulnerable population.

This is what that looks like for me:

- My dad is 71 and has an artificial heart valve. I would not want him to come to a gathering here.
- My uncle is 70 and has asthma. I would not invite him to a gathering here.
- My baby nephew is being successfully treated for cancer. I would not have my baby nephew here for a gathering of people.
- My sister-in-law and brother care for my baby nephew with cancer. I would not invite either of them here.
- My older nephew is five years old, does what normal five year olds do, and lives with his baby brother who is a
 cancer patient. I would not have my nephew come to a gathering here.

Being in a vulnerable health population is about age, health conditions, and who we are caring for at home.

Since the obligation to attend Sunday Liturgy is lifted through September 6, I encourage anyone who fits into a vulnerable population, who cares for anyone who fits that description, who is over 65 years old, who is anxious still about being in larger gatherings for longer periods of time, or who has any symptoms of illness, please stay home on the weekend and tune into our online Liturgy option. For those of you longing for Liturgy in person and to receive the Eucharist, consider a much smaller gathering by coming to a weekday Liturgy in the main worship space. Individual confessions remain by appointment.

TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Jeremiah 20:10-13

The prophet Jeremiah lived about 600 years before Christ. He prophesied that Israel, because of its unfaithfulness to God, would be defeated by Babylon. When this began to happen, many of his friends and neighbors denounced him as a traitor and turned on him.

Romans 5:12-15

Today and for many Sundays hereafter, our second reading will be taken from Paul's letter to the Romans. Paul's letter is his most detailed and important theological work. His purpose in this passage is not to teach about original sin, but to contrast Adam and Christ. From Adam we inherited a strong pull toward sin. From Christ (the "new Adam") we received a gift that is incomparably stronger: Divine Grace.

Matthew 10:26-33

Today's passage is the conclusion of the second discourse by Jesus in Matthew's Gospel. In this second part, Jesus is teaching the Twelve about the challenging demands of discipleship; then he announces the rewards that will be given to those who welcome Jesus' message.

Reflect: Are you willing to take on the discipleship of which Jesus ask you?

DRIVE IN MASS!

Celebrating the weekend Liturgies OUTSIDE enables all who wish to come the opportunity to do so, rather than taking reservations in advance and limiting the number of people attending Mass.

If you are age 65 and older or if you have any condition that will compromise your immune system (or if you care for someone with such a condition) PLEASE STAY HOME! There is no obligation to attend Mass and there is no obligation to receive Holy Communion!

We will continue to record a Liturgy on the weekend for those who do not attend the Liturgy. It will be available for viewing on Saturdays beginning at 4pm on our website; www.saintmarymagdalen.org, Facebook page and YouTube.

Reopening Guide

This is meant to be a conceptual guide. It is not an exact plan for our reopening. It is based on CDC/State Health Department recommendations.



We are moving toward step three which will include two indoor weekend Liturgies by sign-up; an outdoor Sunday Liturgy option, LiveStream Liturgy, and smaller meetings/gatherings in larger meeting spaces.

*Vulnerable Populations: 65 or older, pre-existing health conditions, compromised immunity, and care-takers of previously mentioned populations.

No dates are assigned to movement between steps. CDC/State Health Department guidelines will guide decisions.

Steps can move backward if necessitated by future outbreaks.

Preschool/Religious Formation/Youth related activities depend upon opening and practices of Brighton schools.

REOPENING GUIDE

Our parish reopening guide is a map – not an exact science or a rigid plan – to lead us toward gradually reopening at a pace following our State's Safe Start plan, and takes into account the mood of our community. The purpose of this guide is to help us decide how and when to move forward, or (if necessary) how to move backward. No dates are assigned to movement between the guide steps. Currently we are nearing step three. Highlights of our current reopening practices include:

- Outdoor weekend Liturgy.
- Indoor weekday Liturgy in the main worship space celebrated minimally (i.e., no singing, no assisting liturgical ministers, socially distant seating, socially distant reception of Holy Communion); masks must be worn.
- The parish office remains closed to visitors. The parish staff resumes normal work schedules.
- ♦ All gatherings / meetings must be held online. No general use of meeting spaces of any size.
- Outdoor gatherings of 10 or less people permitted with strict social distancing.

People in vulnerable populations should STAY HOME.



Yes, You Can (and Should) Still Go to the ER for Emergencies During the COVID-19 Pandemic

In the middle of a pandemic, we forget that there are other medical emergencies. Heart attacks, strokes, and other life-threatening emergencies happen every day. According to the CDC, every 40 seconds someone is having a heart attack. Quick treatment for heart attacks and strokes could mean the difference between life and death. Since the pandemic, emergency departments are keeping all patients safe. They have developed protocols to decrease the risk of a COVID-19 transmission. Emergency departments are open and prepared to care for patients safely during the pandemic.

Anyone who is experiencing symptoms of a stroke, heart attack or any another medical emergency should call 911 right away. These include:

- · Coughing up or vomiting blood
- Head injury or any other major injury
- Heart attack symptoms (tightness in the chest and arm, shortness of breath, nausea, lightheadedness)
- · Loss of consciousness
- Poisoning or drug overdose
- Severe burns
- Severe COVID-19 symptoms, including shortness of breath
- Sudden and severe headache
- Severe, persistent abdominal pain
- Shortness of breath
- Stroke symptoms (facial droop, arm weakness, speech difficulties)
- Suicidal feelings

When to bring your child in to the Emergency Department

Symptoms in children that need immediate evaluation include but are not limited to:

- Fever of 100.4°F or higher in newborns 4 weeks of age or younger (fever in children older than 4 weeks may not need to be evaluated in an emergency department; your child's pediatrician can help with decisions about seeking emergency evaluation)
- Asthmatic episodes
- Severe abdominal pain
- Excessive vomiting
- Severe injuries
- Sleeping too much
- Lack of appetite
- Abnormal movements (seizures)
- Anything that would have prompted you to bring your child to the emergency department in the past should warrant a visit to be treated quickly.
