

NEXT SUNDAY'S READINGS

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 Samuel 3:3b-10, 19 Today's reading takes place 11 centuries before Christ at an Israelite shrine, which is referred to as a "temple" in the text. At the shrine was the "Ark of God," a wooden chest overlaid by gold in which the 10 Commandments were kept. Eli was the high priest at the shrine. Samuel was a young man in Eli's service. We will hear how God called Samuel to be a prophetic leader of Israel.

1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20 Today and for the next few Sundays, our second reading will be from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians. Corinth, a port city, was noted for its widespread immorality. Anything and everything was thought permissible. Paul doesn't counter this attitude by putting down the human body as evil or of little worth. Rather, he does just the opposite.

John 1:35-42 The prologue of John's Gospel is a poetic introduction to Jesus, John the Baptist, and major theological themes of John's account. Today's reading is the dramatic encounter of Jesus with His first followers.

Reflect: Jesus says to me, "Come to Me and see." What does Jesus want to show you?

CURRENT PARISH GUIDELINES

- ♦ Indoor weekend Liturgy celebrated in the main worship space. Masks must be worn. No assisting liturgical ministers, socially distant seating, socially distant reception of Holy Communion.
- ♦ Indoor weekday Liturgy in the main worship space celebrated minimally (i.e., no singing, no assisting liturgical ministers, socially distant seating, socially distant reception of Holy Communion). Masks must be worn.
- ♦ Drive up reception of Holy Communion, at the main entrance under the portico, will be available Saturdays 5:45—6:15 pm and Sundays 12:15—12:45 pm.
- ◆The parish staff has normal work schedules. The parish office remains closed to visitors.
- ♦ Gatherings and meetings are held online.
- ♦ Outdoor gatherings of 10 and no more than 50 people permitted with strict social distancing.

There is no obligation to attend Mass and there is no obligation to receive Holy Communion through February 16, 2021.
