TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY

Sirach 3:17–20, 28-29 The book of Sirach was written by a wise teacher who lived 200 years before Christ. Sirach ran a school for young people in Jerusalem. In today's section, he gives his students a string of wise sayings that will guide them in their conduct.

Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24 In today's reading from the letter to the Hebrews, the author contrasts two covenants. He begins with the covenant of Mount Sinai, which was ratified amid fire and darkness. Then he speaks of the new covenant established by Jesus at Mount Zion (which is another name for Jerusalem). The author then looks ahead to a glorious future in the heavenly Jerusalem.

Luke 14:1, 7-14 Once again, Luke finds Jesus at table, but not with social outcasts this time. Here he dines with religious leaders and takes this opportunity to teach some important qualities of discipleship and holiness. Even more, he teaches about the nature of God.

LOWERY'S LINES

Two weeks ago I shared in my article that I had spoken, and would be speaking to, the parish staff (8/8/19), the finance council (8/14/19), and the pastoral council (8/21/19) about our financial position. I would like to explain in this bulletin article the situation we currently face. On August 15 and 16 – with the directive and unanimous consent of the finance council – I reduced the number of people employed on our parish staff as part of the cost cutting that our parish needs to do to regain its solvency. I share the following information optimistically and see it as an opportunity for us to continue to do what we started twenty-six years ago when our parish was founded: working together, blending our talents, and sustaining something very good for the glory of God, and the spiritual growth of all who wish to join us.

When I arrived at the parish I reviewed our operating budget. Our budget year begins July 1 and ends June 30. I noted our income and expenses and that the budget was balanced. Everything looked very good.

The difficulty I discovered is our budget lists both our *Securing Our Future* building fund, and our *Witness to Hope* returns as day-to-day operating income (income for paying our utilities, our staff, staff insurance/benefits, etc.). The problem with this is that both *Securing Our Future* and *Witness to Hope* are restricted funds: *Securing Our Future* is a building fund and *Witness to Hope* returns are earmarked to help pay our mortgage. We cannot take money that is donated for a specific purpose, and spend it to pay our day-to-day expenses; but that is what our budget says we are going to do this year. This amounts to approximately \$236,000.

The next problem we face is that in our checking account we had listed a lot of "exchange money accounts." These are lines in our checking account for money that – for example – the youth group would turn in to the parish after having a car wash. We had multiple exchange money accounts totaling about \$90,000 listed in our checking account. But the problem is we spent that money to pay our bills, yet we continued to list that \$90,000 in the account. We had that money on paper, but not in reality. We also have nearly depleted our savings account, most recently for an emergency roof repair that took place last year, and on the recent sealing and striping of the back of the parking lot.

Why is this happening? Simply put, we are spending too much money on everything. Our expenses (many of which we can control) exceed our Sunday collection income. Our collections have not declined. Each household that contributes money to the parish does so generously.

Our finance council is advising us as a parish, to reduce our current operating budget by up to \$400,000 so we may stabilize our solvency. If we do not do this, we will continue to have to decide what we pay each month: the payroll and benefits for our staff, or the mortgage, or the utilities. We are not a business. We are a parish family. And, like any family, when things are tight one month or one year then the family needs to make economies. This is the task that lies before us. We will continue to cut expenses by lowering budgeted amounts for supplies, staff expenses and professional development, major equipment purchases, and non-critical building maintenance.

I have a sign in my office a woman who was dying of cancer gave to me. It reads, "It is what it is, but it will become what we make of it." Let's work together, communicate clearly and honestly, support one another, stay positive, and entrust ourselves to the prayers of St. Mary Magdalen as we restructure our finances so we may continue to support our youth, our religious formation of children and adults, our outreach to the poor, and our welcoming of all who come to us - all for the sake of witnessing to the Resurrection.

Make the Ignatian Spiritual Exercises

The Ignatian Spiritual Exercises is a pilgrimage of a spiritual search for the fulfillment of a desire for holiness. The exercise experience is about praying, searching, exploring and discovering; it is a journey with God. Christ Jesus is your companion as you learn to walk the life journey path as Jesus. Jesus asks: "What are you looking for?" (Jn1:38) and "Come and see." (Jn 1:39). Those who engage in the Spiritual Exercises discover a response to "What is God asking of me?" The Exercise experience is good for increasing openness to the movement of the Holy Spirit strengthening and supporting you in the effort to respond ever more faithfully to the love of God.

The full Spiritual Exercises may be done in the midst of ordinary daily life at home. It involves a daily commitment of 45-60 minutes in prayer and reflection centered on the themes of the Exercises and a weekly meeting with Linda Chevalier, Spiritual Director for approximately eight or nine months. Linda will meet with you on a weekly basis at her home which allows for reflective conversation and confidentiality. The cost for the Spiritual Exercises is to offer a stipend, payable over the course of the retreat; precise details being discussed during your first conversation.
