

#### **NEXT SUNDAY'S READINGS**

#### **Eleventh Sunday of Ordinary Time**

Ezekiel 17:22-24 Ezekiel was a major Old Testament prophet who ministered to the Jewish people exiled in Babylon. He often used parables and dramatizations to convey his message. In this passage, Ezekiel uses the image of trees to talk about the restoration of Israel and the fall of the Babylonian empire.

2 Corinthians 5:6-10 We continue today to read from Paul's second letter to the Corinthians. In this section of the letter, Paul describes our life on earth as a pilgrimage home to heaven.

Mark 4:26-34 This parable stresses the power of the seed to grow in and of itself, mysteriously producing the blade, ear, and finally the ripe grain. Jesus initiates the reign of God by sowing the word, maturing to the kingdom of heaven. We are invited to apply this parable to our own life situations.

Reflect: What symbol would you use to describe our life's journey?

#### **RELIGIOUS FORMATION**

#### **Religious Formation Schedule Changes**

This upcoming formation year, our program is going to offer classes on Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings. The new class sessions will follow this schedule:

#### Sunday

10:15-11:45AM; Level 1-8

12:00-2:00PM; Confirmation Note: Level 2 (First Reconciliation and Eucharist) cannot be enrolled in without first completing Level 1.

#### Wednesday

5:30-7:00PM; Level 1-8

I believe this change will be the catalyst for many new and welcome graces in our parish. By revising and reimagining the structure of our program, especially the Sunday session (more on that below,) we are free to dream big about what is possible! I envision that, in time, we will see an increase in the number of families attending Sunday Mass, more support for our catechists and volunteers, and new retreat opportunities, along with other special events.

As I mentioned above, the Sunday session will be different than it has been in the past. Previously, this was our "Family Program" which met fewer times and with a slightly different focus/curriculum than the week night sessions. Going forward, Sunday classes for levels 1-8 will meet the same number of times and follow the same curriculum as the Wednesday night session.

In a sense, that means there is no more "Family Program." However, family engagement is one of my biggest goals moving forward. For the past year, we have focused on parents' role as their children's primary catechist. That will never change. While this means there is no longer a dedicated "family program" with a separate adult class, every program we offer will strive to engage the entire family in new ways.

If you have any questions about this new schedule, please contact me; I am happy to discuss the changes with you!

#### **Early Registration Tuition Discount**

The early registration period for the 2021-2022 Formation year is underway <u>until June 30</u>. Families who register and pay in full within one week, will receive an early registration discount of \$12 off the normal tuition rate. Please consider registering as soon as possible; it is tremendously helpful to us as we plan the upcoming year.

Tuition rates for the 2021-2022 Formation year will be as follows:

### **Catholic Social Teachings**

So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead. James 2:17

Christ and our Church teach that faith without action is empty. In other words, "talking the talk without walking the walk" was rejected by Jesus. We do that in many ways: participating in the Eucharist, receiving the sacraments, praying often, and others. The Church also encourages social interaction through the Corporal and Spiritual Work of Mercy.

As Catholics, we should understand what Christ and the Catholic Church teach about social responsibilities - about how we should act as a moral person. Our church provides a definitive document to guide us, the Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church. It teaches us how to love our neighbor based on two millennia of apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, teachers, saints, philosophers, thinkers, and reformers pondering the implications of Jesus' teaching and, what is more, living it out. Its purpose is for us to better understand the Church's teaching and, more importantly, what Jesus expects of us. This can be explained through the four pillars of Catholic social teaching:

- The Dignity of the Human Person
- The Common Good
- Subsidiarity
- Solidarity

Over the next few weeks, this column will summarize the four pillars. As Catholics, we must reflect on how these teachings might change our parish, and each of us.
