#### **LOWERY'S LINES**

#### Advent is here...turn on the lights!

I still remember at a previous assignment being asked if it was ok to turn on the Christmas lights outside on the shrubs around the church. I was not guite sure what to make of the guestion. Why was I being asked? What was I being drawn into? Who was my decision going to make happy and who would it make mad? It was explained to me that the outside lights were not allowed to be turned on until Christmas Eve, but the lights were put in place at the beginning of Advent because chances were that the weather would be more accommodating earlier in the season than later.

The Advent season is a celebration of the Light that is and that is to come. The consolation of Christmas lights, candles, fires in the fireplace, all of these things can lift our spirits as the days grow darker and darker. They can remind us of the joy of both the Advent and Christmas seasons. We know that the physical darkness will decrease a bit each day after Christmas. The days will grow longer again. We also know that the spiritual darkness of sin and division has been vanquished by the generous love of our God incarnate, making a dwelling among us, through Jesus Christ, the morning star that never sets and whose day is eternal.

This Advent let us take some time to enjoy the Christmas lights that go on way before Christmas Eve in the neighborhoods, at the stores, maybe in our own home. They are previews of even greater things to come. As we see the lights of the season go on, let us also make a plan to reflect the Light for the ones God brings into our lives each day, and especially to the ones we welcome this weekend who are among us preparing for full Christian Initiation later this year at Easter.

#### SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

#### Isaiah 11: 1-10

The prophet Isaiah lived 750 years before Christ. Despite the political unrest of that period, he looks forward to a kingdom so wonderful that even nature is at peace. This perfect world would be ruled by a descendent of King David. Jesse in today's reading is the name of David's father.

#### Romans 15: 4-9

In the early days of the Church, some of the Jewish people who became Christians continued to practice their Jewish traditions. Many of them were members of the Church in Rome, along with others who were Gentiles. They sometimes found it hard to get along. As Paul nears the end of his letter to them, he encourages them to live in harmony by drawing upon the Scriptures they had in common.

#### Matthew 3: 1-12

The verses assigned in today's Gospel may have been the beginning of the whole story of Jesus. Today's Gospel reading is long with some difficult descriptions. "Repent!" "Prepare!" "Make Straight!"

Reflect: In your own sphere of influence, what situations call out for justice and peace? What can you do about them this week?

#### First Sunday of Advent

Today begins the season of Advent. This holy season seems to sneak up on and surprise us as it begins right



after the busy Thanksgiving holiday. It is not unlike the surprise Mary received when she was given the news she was pregnant with Jesus! Although the four weeks of Advent are full of hustle and bustle leading up to Christmas, we need to remember the season of Advent is a special time for us to pause, reflect and prepare for the gift of God's love coming to us through the baby Jesus.

#### Advent Traditions—The Colors of Advent

Advent colors are worn by the priests and deacons and decorate the church. They are also represented in the candles that surround the Advent wreath. Look around the church and see where you can find the colors of Advent. Some of the colors you may see are purple or violet which symbolizes royalty, repentance and fasting, pink or rose symbolizing joy and white signifying light and purity.

# Advent Children's Activity Create an Advent Tree of Kindness

Help your children or grandchildren prepare for Jesus' coming by doing good deeds for others and creating an Advent Tree of Kindness.

### For each child you will need:

- \*One large sheet of red construction paper
- \*One large sheet of green construction paper
- \*Glue. scissors
- \*A sheet of star stickers
- \*List of good deeds

#### **Directions:**

Ask the children to brainstorm good deeds they can do for others. Write down or type up the list of good deeds and make a copy for each child

Have the children cut out a Christmas tree using the green paper. Glue the tree on the red paper. Pass out the stickers and list of good deeds. Explain that the stars are to put on their tree *after* they do a good deed for someone else. (Good deeds can come from the list or be something they want to add to their list.) Hopefully, as Advent comes to an end, your child's tree is full of stars and their heart is full of joy!


